STEP-BY-STEP INCORPORATION GUIDE

What you need to know to form a business.

SOLE PROPRIETORSHIP

This resource will help entrepreneurs understand the steps required to legally incorporate and operate in New York State. Not all business structures that are available under the New York Business Corporations Law are included; only the most common ones are within our Step-By-Step Incorporation Guide Info sheets.

SOLE PROPRIETORSHIP DEFINED

A sole proprietorship is a one-person owned/controlled business. Also known as a "DBA" (Doing Business As). The owner is personally liable for all business debts.

STEP-BY-STEP >>>

Begin Operating.

2.

File Certificate of Assumed Name (if applicable).

- Filing Fees: \$25 for Certificate of Assumed Name plus county clerk fees for each county the business intends to do business.
 - o \$100 for each county within NYC, and \$25 for each county outside NYC.

Depending on the municipality, you may be required to attain certain operating or occupancy permits. It is recommended that you contact your local Small Business Development Center.

An EIN is required if hiring employees, opening a business bank account and making purchases on behalf of the business.
