

Tobacco-Free Campus Policy

Albany Law School is committed to providing a safe, healthy environment for students, faculty, staff and visitors. In support of this commitment, the law school has adopted a tobacco-free campus policy in conjunction with the Albany College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences. Tobacco cessation support is widely available for all interested parties.

Tobacco-Free Campus Policy

Due to the acknowledged health hazards arising from tobacco products, including exposure to secondhand smoke and vaping aerosols, Albany Law School's policy provides a tobacco-free environment for all employees, students, and visitors. This policy covers tobacco and vape of any kind, including the use of smokeless or "spit" tobacco, electronic cigarettes, and applies to all employees, students, and visitors of the law school.

Use of tobacco, vape or tobacco products is prohibited in or on any Albany Law School facility or property, owned or leased, at any time.

Use of tobacco, vape or tobacco products is prohibited in any Albany Law School vehicle at any time.

Sale of tobacco or vape products on campus is prohibited.

Placement of tobacco or vape advertisements is prohibited in Albany Law School sponsored publications and on law school property.

In keeping with Albany Law School's commitment to protect and promote the health of its employees, students, visitors and other campus constituencies, and the public in general, it is the law school's policy to provide a tobacco and vape free environment in all facilities and outdoor areas in full conformance with applicable

statutes, including the New York State Clean Indoor Air Act (Public Health Law Article 13-E).

Please be respectful of the surrounding community and private properties located in proximity of the Albany Law School campus.

Tobacco-Free Campus Definitions

"Tobacco" or "tobacco products" includes tobacco of any kind, including the use of smokeless tobacco, "spit" tobacco, electronic cigarettes, vape, cigars, cigarettes, pipes or any other smoking material or device.

"Law school facilities" or "law school property" refers to any campus building, owned or leased, including but not limited to: private offices; lounges; dining areas; recreational areas; all law school owned, leased, or rented vehicles; and any personally owned, leased or rented vehicles parked on Albany Law School property.

"Campus" includes any law school outdoor area that is open to access by the campus community or public, including but not limited to: parking lots, sidewalks, athletic fields, lawn areas and any law school facility entrance or exit.
